Obediah Brumfield Pipes and Josephine Bonapart (Edwards) Pipes

Josephine was born in 1849 in Boyle County, the daughter of James Franklin Edwards and Martha (Walston) Edwards. Raised in Boyle County, she was a teacher when in March of 1869 she married Obediah Brumfield Pipes. Obediah, born in 1835 just east of the cemetery, was a Civil War Veteran and the son of Nathaniel Pipes and Margaret (Harmon) Pipes. Obediah and Josephine farmed just across the Washington County Line, north of Ben Minor Ridge Road. Nine children were born into their family from 1870 to 1885.
